Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court Community Service Frequently Asked Questions

What is Community Service?

Community service is labor, but it also benefits the public at large. It is an opportunity to help a governmental or non-profit agency with its work. The type of work can include clerical and janitorial to pulling weeds or building food pallets to help feed hungry New Mexicans. A Defendant may also be approved by the Court to perform community service by enrolling in job training in an academic or vocational program or by participating in a social service or rehabilitation program. Take this opportunity to be professional because sometimes an obligation can turn into an opportunity.

Where do I go to perform community service?

Attached is a list of Court approved Community Service Agencies.

Can I perform community service at an agency not on the Court's list or outside of Albuquerque?

No, unless the Judge allows you to do this. To ask the Judge for permission to complete community service at an agency not on the Court's list or out of town, you must file a Motion with the Court. Blank Motions are available in the Court's Self Help Center. You also may want to speak with an attorney about this.

How do I register for community service?

You must contact the agency to schedule a date and time when you can work. You should have your Court papers with you when you register.

Can I complete my community service at more than one agency?

Yes, you can complete your hours at more than one agency so long as you complete by the due date ordered by the Court.

Do I need to take any paperwork with me when I go to the community service agency?

Yes, you must take the paperwork the Judge gave you and a government approved identification card.

Can I perform community service in payment of the fines, fees, and costs I owe to the Court?

Yes, you may perform community service (in addition to any mandatory hours of community service ordered by the Judge) as payment for the fines and fees you owe to the Court. If you decide to do this, you will receive credit toward your fines, fees, and costs at twice the State Hourly Minimum Wage Rate. However, you must keep track of the number of extra community service hours that you need to work to pay the fines, fees, and costs you owe to the Court and complete those extra hours by the deadline the Judge gave you to pay. You also can pay fines, fees, and costs by doing both hours of community service and making payments in whatever combination and amounts you decide so long as you complete/pay by the deadline set by the Court.

Can I perform community services for all of the programs and services ordered by the Court?

No, you can only perform of community services for the fines, fees, and costs owed to the Court. Examples of the types of fees that are not owed to the Court and where you cannot perform community service in payment are fees owed to CrimeStoppers, fees for treatment and counseling, for drug tests performed outside the Court, victim impact panel, or for schools that are not run by the Court. However, if you are ordered to the Court's own Driver Improvement School, Aggressive Driving School, or DWI school, then you can perform additional hours of community service in payment of those school fees. If you cannot afford to pay these fees, you must file a Motion with the Court. Blank Motions are available in the Court's Self Help Center. You also may want to speak with an attorney about this.

Can I perform community service in payment of monthly probation costs?

Yes, you may perform community service (in addition to any mandatory hours of community service ordered by the Judge) as payment for your monthly probation costs. If you want to do this, you should speak to your Probation Officer, who can provide you with a tracking form so you can receive credit toward payment of your probation costs at twice the State Hourly Minimum Wage Rate. However, you must keep track of the number of extra community service hours that you need to work to pay the probation costs that you owe to the Court and complete those extra hours by the monthly deadlines your Probation Officer gives you. You will need to turn in your tracking form with the hours you worked every month before the deadline in order to receive credit for those costs.

Can I get an extension on my deadline to perform community service or to pay fines, fees, and costs ?

That is up the Judge. To ask the Judge for an extension of your deadline, you must file a Motion with the Court. Blank Motions are available in the Court's Self Help Center. You also may want to speak with an attorney about this.

Will I be paid wages for my hours of community service, or be entitled to any benefits?

No, you will not be entitled to wages or be considered an employee of the Community Service Agency where you perform community service. You will not be entitled to workers' compensation, unemployment, or any other benefits otherwise provided by law. Also, the Court will not be held liable for any injuries or any losses sustained by you while performing your community service hours.

What happens if I don't complete my community service hours or pay my fines, fees, and costs by the deadline ordered by the Court?

If you fail to complete the community service hours or pay the fines, fees, and costs by your deadline, a Criminal Summons will be issued for you to come before the Judge to explain why you have not complied with Court orders. A Warrant also may be issued for your arrest.
